ICS I-100

ICS I-100 is an introductory course and overview of the Incident Command System. The course takes an average of 2 to 4 hours to complete.

ICS I-200 (Must be taken in a class).

The *online* ICS I-200 course is **not recognized** by [ICS Canada](#).

ICS I-200 enables personnel to operate efficiently during an incident or event within the command system. It provides training and resources for personnel who may have a supervisory position within the command system.

You must complete ICS I-100 before you can enrol in ICS I-200. The course takes an average of 10 to 14 hours to complete.

ICS I-300 Must be taken in class)

This course builds on previous incident command knowledge and defines the unique qualities of ICS as an event or incident management system in an expanding situation. The course is designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently using the ICS in supervisory roles on expanding incidents. The course units and lessons provide a review of ICS fundamentals, assessing incidents and setting objectives, Unified Command, Resource Management, the planning process, demobilization, transfer and termination of command of an incident. Prerequisite: ICS 200, ICS Canada requires six months between completion of ICS 200 and attending ICS 300

In accordance with ICS Canada requirements: Students must have completed an ICS Canada recognized ICS 200 course at least 6 months prior to attending ICS 300.
